## How the competition works

From registering to submitting a finished story, the whole process is designed to be simple. Four steps — as much or as little time as your child wants to give to it.

1

### Register

60 seconds at [jaycesworldoflearning.co.uk/bfctc/register/](https://jaycesworldoflearning.co.uk/bfctc/register/). We'll email you the Guidelines PDF and a personal submission link.

2

### Read the Guidelines

A quick read that explains what to write, what to include, and what to avoid. A few minutes over a cup of tea.

3

### Help your child write

2026 theme: **Climate Change & The Environment**. Any length. Any style. Story or poem. Tips on the next page.

4

### Submit by 11 September

Upload at [jaycesworldoflearning.co.uk/bfctc/submit/](https://jaycesworldoflearning.co.uk/bfctc/submit/). Registered families get a shortcut link; if you didn't register, submit directly.

### A note about registering

Registering isn't a requirement — you can submit your child's story directly. But registering means we send you the Guidelines, a few writing tips as the weeks go by, and a friendly reminder before the deadline. Marketing emails are opt-in — untick the box and you'll only receive transactional emails about your entry.

#### What we won't do

- ✓ We will not share your data with third parties.
- ✓ Your child's story is only shared with our judging panel and, if shortlisted, our anthology publishing team.
- ✓ Your child's full name, school, and any identifying photographs are never published without your separate written permission.
- ✓ You can withdraw your child's entry at any time before the anthology is committed to print — just email us.

# How to help your child write

Every child writes differently. Some race to the page; some need a while to warm up. Here's what tends to work.

1

### Let them talk it out first

Before pens or keyboards, ask your child to tell you the story out loud. Stories start as speech in every culture on earth.

2

### Follow their imagination

The theme is Climate Change, but the story can be anything — a talking tree, a hopeful future, a superhero polar bear. Judges love originality.

3

### Read Our Stories, Our World

The 2025 anthology is at [jaycesworld.co.uk](http://jaycesworld.co.uk) — £8.99 paperback or £1 digital. Reading it together shows what "published by a child" actually looks like.

4

### Little and often

Fifteen minutes a day for a fortnight beats one long marathon. That's how writers really work — even the professional ones.

5

### Type or handwrite

Handwritten stories can be photographed or scanned and uploaded as a PDF. Some children write more freely by hand.

6

### Celebrate the finish

Every child who submits has done something extraordinary. The finished story is the real prize — the anthology is a bonus. Tell them so.

## Common questions

### How long should the story be?

There is no minimum or maximum. A poem of ten lines is as welcome as a story of two thousand words.

### Can I type it up for my child?

Yes. Typing up a child's handwritten story is fine. Rewriting or improving the words on their behalf is not — the voice must be the child's.

### My child has additional needs — can they still enter?

Absolutely. All abilities are warmly welcomed. Email [info@jaycesworldoflearning.co.uk](mailto:info@jaycesworldoflearning.co.uk) if we can help with any adjustments.

### Can more than one child in my family enter?

Yes — one entry per child, and each child needs their own registration. No family limit.

## Submitting & what happens next

- 1 Save the story as a single file.** PDF is easiest — .docx or .txt also work. Max 5MB. Handwritten stories can be scanned or photographed and combined into one PDF.
- 2 Visit the submission page.** Go to [jaycesworldoflearning.co.uk/bfctc/submit/](https://jaycesworldoflearning.co.uk/bfctc/submit/). If you registered, click the personal link in your email — most of the form is already filled in.
- 3 Upload and confirm.** Add the story title, upload the file, tick the parental and publication consent boxes, and hit Submit. Confirmation email within a few minutes.

### What happens after you submit

- Within 7 days** We acknowledge every entry by email.
- October 2026** Judging panel begins shortlisting.
- November 2026** Shortlisted authors and their families are contacted.
- Early 2027** The 2026 anthology publishes; National Book Launch takes place.

**If your child is shortlisted:** winners are professionally published in the 2026 anthology, receive a certificate, are invited (with a parent) to the National Book Launch, and join the Young Literacy Advocates programme. There is no cash prize — the value is in the publication credit and the community that grows around it.
